WHAT IS THE SILICON VALLEY **GUARANTEED INCOME PROJECT**?

The goals of the Silicon Valley Guaranteed Income Project (SVGIP) are to 1) understand the needs and experiences of families in difficult housing situations and/or experiencing homelessness, and 2) explore if and how no-strings cash payments (also called 'Guaranteed Income') given directly to families for 2 years improves their living situation, health & well-being.

We will conduct surveys with 300 families about every 6 months for 3 years. Half of families will be selected to receive guaranteed income, or payments equivalent to \$1,000 a month for 24 months (2 years). We will compare the experiences of families receiving usual services versus those receiving guaranteed income to understand if and how guaranteed income helps families experiencing unstable housing and/or homelessness.



WHY ARE WE DOING **THIS PROJECT?**

We want to better understand the experiences and needs of families experiencing unstable housing or homelessness, and how no-strings cash payments might help families gain greater independence over their lives, finances. and futures.

The knowledge and experiences you share with us by participating in our study sessions will be used to develop policies and programs, to better help families like yours in the future.

STUDY TIMELINE



HOW DID YOU GET MY NAME?

We received your name from our community partners, ¡Sí Se Puede! Collective and/or the Santa Clara County Office of Supportive Housing.

WHO CAN JOIN?

We plan to enroll 300 families in Santa Clara County who are experiencing homelessness or unstable housing, and who agree to participate in this study. 150 families will be selected through a computerized lottery to receive guaranteed income (equivalent to \$1,000/month for 24 months).

Please note, by participating in this study you will be eligible to be selected to receive guaranteed income.

Families who participate in the study have a 50% chance of being randomly selected to receive guaranteed income.

All families will also have the opportunity to receive more information and counseling on public benefits and assistance.

Your participation will help other families like yours, by contributing knowledge for better policies and programs to end homelessness and housing instability
